



## **Community FASD Presentations**

Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder (FASD) encompasses a range of physical and neurodevelopmental problems that can result from prenatal alcohol exposure. It is brain damage and it is often known as the “Invisible Disability” as there are rarely physical indicators of it. Currently there are at least 4% of Canadians living with FASD and their symptoms can vary from person to person. It can be very challenging to get a diagnosis, which often leads to many individuals struggling without an understanding of their disability.

The following presentations are beneficial to anyone who would like to learn more about FASD. We have provided this training to Schools, Mental Health Organizations, Community Services and Supports, and families. There is no cost to these presentations.

### **FASD 101**

This presentation focuses on FASD awareness, the symptoms of the disability; how it effects the child’s daily living; and the strategies that can help everyone gain a better understanding and experience more success when working with the person living with FASD. We also discuss community resources and local services that may be helpful.

### **FASD 102**

In this presentation we further explore key concepts in our work with people living with an FASD. This training includes an interactive case study in which participants can apply the skills they have learned in FASD 101 and FASD 102. FASD 101 is a prerequisite for this presentation.
