We are looking for a true collaborator who is knowledgeable about accessing cross-sectoral community resources and has a strong understanding of the principles of WrapAround. You're a proven facilitator, an excellent communicator, and you understand the importance of working with a diverse group of people with unique perspectives and experiences.

What You'll Do:

Wraparound process is a person/family driven, team based planning process that develops an individualized plan that uses the strengths of the person/family and their team members to develop strategies that the whole team takes on that effectively address the person's/family's needs on a day to day basis. The philosophy of WrapAround encourages family choice, family ownership and family empowerment. The WrapAround Facilitator is responsible for guiding the family through a process of Wraparound (ie: identifying family goals, ensuring a strength-based approach, helping the family develop a team, guiding the team to work towards independence, etc.).

What Experience You Bring:

The ideal candidate will have a minimum of 5 years experience working in children's mental health or developmental services, post secondary education and experience in social services along with the following:

- Demonstrated ability to work collaboratively with individuals, families, and multidisciplinary teams
- Proven faciliation skills are an absolute necessity
- Proven ability to develop, implement, and monitor strength-based plans
- Excellent interpersonal and written communication skills
- Ability to work in an environment of change
- Proven ability to work both independently and collaboratively
- Maintain client/family related information in the CSCN information system
